Key housing and homelessness facts 1966-70

- **Official homelessness statistics for England and Wales: 18,689. Shelter believe it to be over a million.**
- **1.8 million houses “unfit for human habitation”.**
- **1,641,270 people statutorily overcrowded, and at least 390,610 people extremely overcrowded.**
- **4,364 children “in care” for no other reason than that their families live in unsatisfactory housing conditions.**

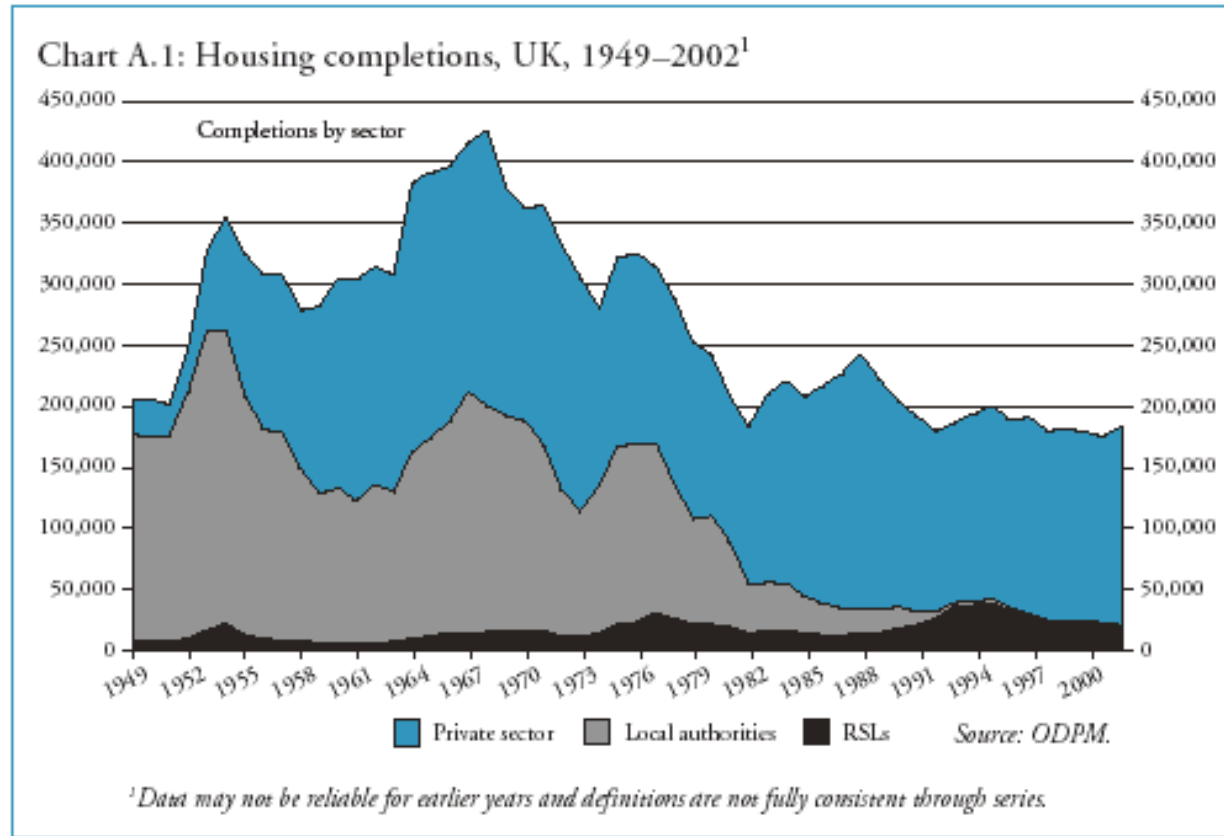
Key housing and homelessness facts 2004/05

- **195,000 homeless households.**
- **100,970 households in temporary accommodation.**
- **885,000 unfit homes.**
- **510,000 overcrowded households.**
