Shelter SA, the peak body for housing, seeks the inclusion of housing as an additional Chapter of the Manifesto. When the South Australian Liberal Party develops public policy around the Manifesto, housing will be included as a critical element of the achievement of the first nine goals and the basis upon which citizens can achieve health, education and employment.

We Believe

- All South Australians will have an affordable, safe place to call home by 2036.
- Secure housing and employment are key to our State's health, wellbeing and economy.
- We must stimulate South Australia's entrepreneurial efforts to ensure affordable housing for individuals and families living on low incomes.
- The prosperity of South Australia demands vibrant and productive regional communities that provide affordable housing for all citizens.
- Individual and family prosperity is only possible with access to affordable housing so that all South Australians can contribute to our common good through sustained education, employment and health.
- The South Australian Government will support the increased development of affordable housing, for people living on low incomes, as the backbone of our economy.
- The role of Government is to create the right conditions for social and affordable housing to flourish.

How we will achieve this together

- 1.1 South Australia will invest in programs to increase the supply of social and affordable housing.
- 1.2 Ensuring the most vulnerable individuals and families in our community have quick access to safe and stable housing to maximise the value of support provided by Government and the community so they can more readily participate in the social and economic life of our State.
- 1.3 Ensuring all relevant Government agencies play a clear and transparent role in increasing access to affordable places for South Australians to live.
- 1.4 South Australia will foster innovative solutions to all tiers of homelessness through the supply of affordable, safe and sustainable housing.
- 1.5 Ensuring the South Australian Government undertakes cross-portfolio responsibility for our vulnerable citizens.
- 1.6 Unlocking community resources and assets in our regional areas to ensure service responses keep our children and young people safe.
