The Pickle app connects young people who are experiencing homelessness, at risk of homelessness, or in unsafe situations, to the nearest possible service organisation, ensuring they get the help they need right when they need it. Pickle is free, quick and private. Developed by Shelter SA with support from a DCSI Community Benefit SA grant, Pickle is based on research and community sector consultation about young people's use of technology. Prioritising simplicity and privacy, the app takes a new approach to the ongoing challenge of young people's access to services. Australian Homelessness Monitor - Online survey of homelessness service providers

You are invited to participate in the [Australian Homelessness Monitor \(AHM\)](#) study which is being funded by Launch Housing (Melbourne). This important project takes its cue from the [UK Homelessness Monitor](#) - an independent national review of homelessness policy developments and statistical trends conducted annually in Britain since 2011. In collaboration with the University of Queensland, the UKHM model has been adapted to meet the Australian context. The questionnaire seeks to gauge service provider impressions of recent change in the incidence and nature of 'homelessness demand'. The survey comprises 8 questions about your organisation, about the scale and nature of homelessness demand, about the availability of suitable accommodation for different demand groups, and about the perceived homelessness impacts of recent policy change. It should take 10-20 minutes to complete. The cut off date for completing the survey is Friday 17 July. To take part in the survey please [click here](#).
