

# Indy Johar

*Dark Matter Laboratories, UK*

*Key Note International Speaker*



Indy Johar is an architect, co-founder of 00 (project00.cc) and a Senior Innovation Associate with the Young Foundation and Visiting Professor at the University of Sheffield.

Indy, on behalf of 00, has co-founded multiple social ventures from Impact Hub Westminster to Impact Hub Birmingham and the HubLaunchpad Accelerator, along with working with large global multinationals and institutions to support their transition to a positive Systems Economy. He has co-lead research projects such as The Compendium for the Civic Economy, whilst supporting several 00 explorations/experiments including the wikihouse.cc, opendesk.cc. Indy is an Advisor to the Earth Security Initiative and a director of WikiHouse Foundation.

Indy Johar is a co-founder of the Project00.cc Research Laboratory & Skunk Works. He is a Fellow of the RSA, Respublica Fellow, JRF Anti-Poverty Strategy Programme Advisory Group member and a member of the Mayor of London's SME Working Group and most recently a member of the RSA Inclusive Growth Commission. Indy was Director of the Global Impact Hub Association and Impact Hub Islington [the original Impact Hub in the Hub Network] and worked with Jonathan Robinson to design the protocols and modes of the network scaling. Indy has taught and lectured at various institutions from the University of Bath, TU-Berlin; Architectural Association, University College London, Princeton. He has written for many national and international publications on the future of design, systems change and social investment

# Tim Horton

*Registrar NSW Architects Registration Board*



Tim Horton is an architect, nationally recognised as an adviser and agitator for smart policy that enables good design. He has worked in nationally and internationally in both the private and public sector. In 2014, Tim was the Registrar of the NSW Architects Registration Board; an independent statutory authority that exists to inform and engage people on issues of architecture in NSW. A former founding CEO of the Committee for Adelaide and former Commissioner for Integrated Design based in Adelaide, South Australia, his interests lie at the intersections of design, technology, innovation and governance, architecture, city planning, and the application of research in creative public policy. Tim has is also the former President of the Australian Institute of Architects (SA Chapter), Chair of the National Practice Committee of the Australian Institute of Architects, member

of the Australian Government's Built Environment Industry Innovation Council and a regular contributor to media on built environment policy, design practice, and public sector innovation.

## Darryl Gobbett

Along with his senior role with Baillieu Holst Ltd, the national stockbroking and financial advisory firm, Darryl is also a Visiting Fellow with the University of Adelaide's South Australian Centre for Economic Studies (SACES).
